


Conformity Assessment involves aspects of testing to verify whether a product/appliance meets the set standards. The EELA Project has made available portable lighting test equipment for each Member State. Additionally, the project will capacitate two regional test centers. The EELA projects would like to establish a collaborative network where Member States share intelligence information on EE appliances through MRAs.

1. What challenges do you foresee with the compliance framework implementation?
2. Do you engage / Would you consider engaging customs to check imported product compliance with EE requirements?
3. Will you be interested in adopting regional product registration system (PRS) for product registration? What barriers/challenges you foresee that may prevent you from using the regional system?
